Walking in Phrygian Footsteps

Using green technologies
to excavate a city from the time of King Midas



The ongoing archaeological work at the large Phrygian city located at Kerkenes Dag in Turkey, dating to ca. 610-550 BCE, illustrates some of the many ways that green technologies can be applied within archaeology. Simulations developed here, based on physiological models of people walking, provide an intriguing tool that can be used both to understand ancient cities and to assist modern city planners in designing cities that require less automobile traffic. This talk will provide an introduction to the ancient city, an overview of how these methods are being applied, as well as an introduction to additional ways that green technologies are being used through the Kerkenes Eco-Center.
